

## Wildfire Safety

**Before a Wildfire:** 

Many wildfires begin unnoticed and spread very quickly in grassy or wooded areas. Wildfires can create a dense smoke that fills the area for miles surrounding the actual fire. Wildfires can be caused by lightning or volcano eruptions, but 80% are caused by arsonists or by people who are careless.

When a Wildfire Threatens:

| Make sure fire vehicles can get to your home.<br>Clearly mark all driveway entrances and make<br>sure your house number is clearly visible from<br>the street. |   | Listen to the radio or television for updates and directions from local, state, and federal officials.                                     |
| Test your fire alarms/smoke detectors once a month. Replace batteries as necessary.  |   | Turn on a light in each room of your home. The light will make it easier to see through heavy smoke.                                       |
|  |   | Turn off propane tanks.  |
| Practice your Family Emergency Communications Plan.  |   | Wet or remove any shrubs within 15 ft. of your house.  |
| Plan more than one escape route from your house and pick a meeting place so you know everyone has gotten out of the house and is safe.                         |   | If you are advised to evacuate, do so immediately. Lock all doors and windows. Tell someone else where you are going.                      |
| Teach children about fire safety and keep matches and other fires starters out of their reach.   |   | After a Wildfire:  |
| Get rid of leaves, twigs and tree limbs that are laying around your property.  |   | Do not return to your home until officials tell you it is safe.  |
| Mow your lawn regularly.   |   |  |
| Remove any vines that are growing on the outside of your house.  |   | Resources  |

| Review your homeowner's insurance and update a list of your home's contents.   | • | Visit <u>riema.ri.gov/preparedness/evacuation</u> to learn your local evacuation routes.   |
| Pay attention to burn notices.   | • | Visit <u>riema.ri.gov/preparedness/</u> to download a Family Emergency Communications Plan.  |
